

Prevent



- Ongoing consultation from Todd McGhee
- Continued collaboration with Framingham Police

Physical security enhancements:

- Changed interior locks in ECC, Elementary, Secondary, Audiology, Schwab Athletic Center, the Administration Building, and Pipe House.
- Next up: Walden School & 300 House





Prevent



- Keyless entry:
 - Continuing to add slide card readers on buildings.
 - Centralized all keyless entry access changes in HR; access assigned by position
- Will replace exterior keys on all buildings
 starting 3/27/24



Prepare



- Layered Solutions expansion:
- Configured 15 more remotes to lockdown campus. Total remotes: 19
- Installed 15 receivers throughout campus.
- Tested remotes and receivers on 3/15/24
- Replaced 94 TVs on campus!





Prepare



- All new staff receive Run, Hide, Fight training when hired
- Lockdown drill: Framingham Police have asked that we coordinate with them
 - Date TBD Staff ONLY first, then with students
 - Communication- all stakeholders
 - Family Forum with Todd McGhee and Karen Bishop (COO) before drill with students
- Recertify the first group of trainers this Spring.
