
How often do you want in person TLCPA meetings


What time would be best for a meeting in person?

Since I don't really know the community yet, I don't have a good pulse on what other parents may or may not be interested in, especially those with older kids.

I would like to hear more about things happening in the school and how we can make an impact. Including this group and allowing votes on important decisions being made about our children's education, safety and overall experience at TLC. In the past this group would hold votes and felt very collaborative, not just an informational gathering.

Issues at TLC - Lack of respect for self, peers, teachers, etc. Bullying @ TLC seems to be at an all time high.... WHY? What is being done to stop it? How is TLC a "bilingual bicultural school" as advertised? I hear these same issues from many parents - several have pulled their kids out of TLC & several continue to stay & struggle. Becauses there is high turnover at TLC it seems staff also needs training, professional development, workshops on bilingual programming/education. Kids are dismissed early (1/2 day) at least once/month for staff professional development. It seems that there is the time & place to do this educating and refreshing for staff. And of course teacher salaries are a big issue among staff. I hope we can join to support them!
